Began with a quick recap of the past meetings to bring all new members up to speed.

Discussion on the four priorities: mental health, obesity, substance abuse and socioeconomic disparities. Instead of having disparities be a main focus on its own, can we find the disparities within each of the other priorities? Focus on the effects of the disparities in each categories.

How should the assessment be broken apart? By service area of the hospitals or areas of the county? Two different options are included in the handouts. Decided that working with areas would be best way and would encourage working together between hospitals. Most hospitals are willing to work together because they have common goals.

Jim has still not heard from Floodwood. They would like to get Floodwood involved with the process. Hoping to touch base soon. Jim is also hoping to get the health providers involved. He will be reaching out to them.

Jim spoke with the tribes and they would like a section in the assessment but do not want to be a part of the building of the assessment.

Very important that we focus on building a strong framework so we can build and improve after each future report.

The creation of the report will continue throughout 2017 and be completed by the end of the year. 2018 will be the start of creating action items. After programs/actions items are created there will be an annual update. Creating a resource plan and focusing on policy will be important.

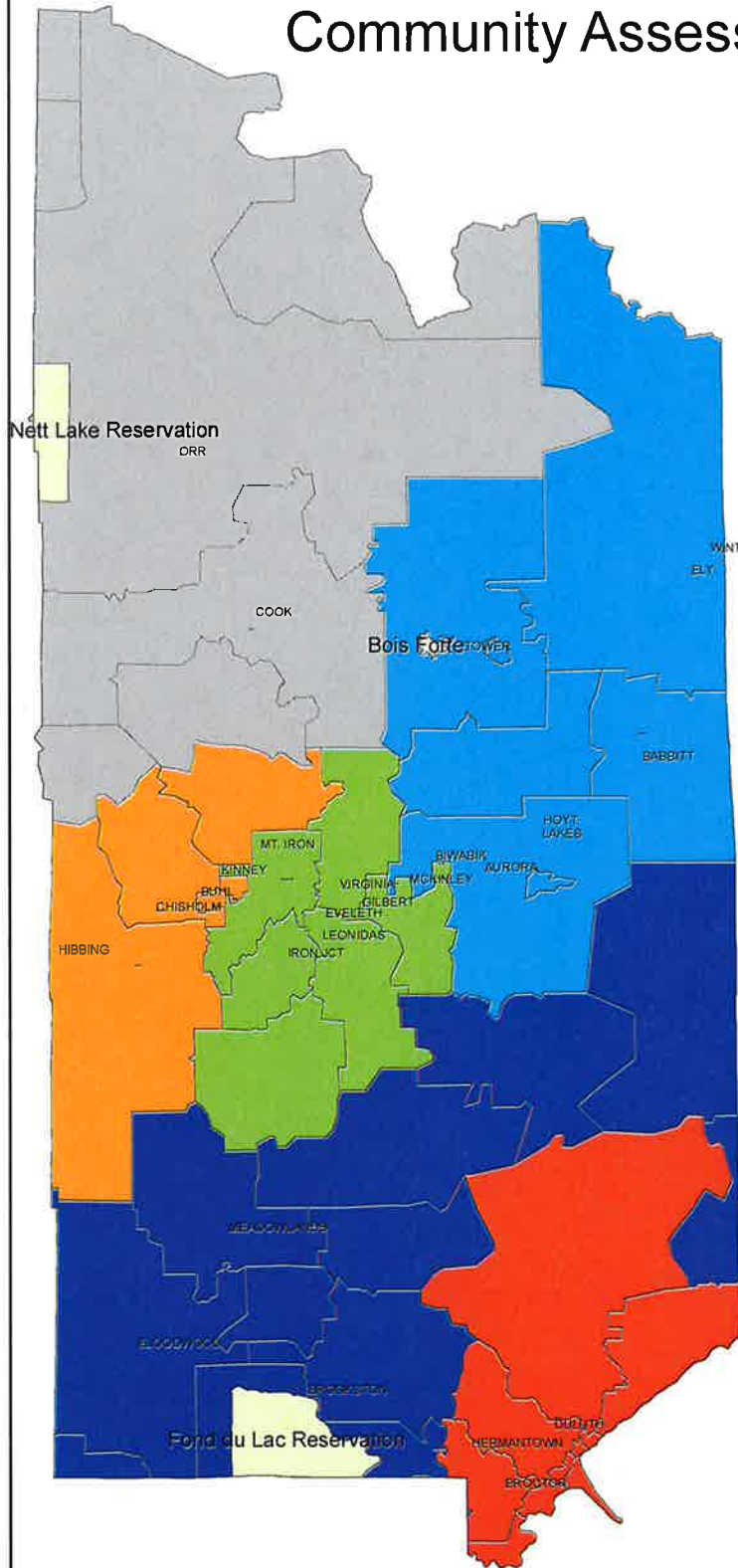
Discussion of how data should be collected for the assessment. Surveys, focus groups and data collection have been how the assessments have been created in the past. Also a discussion to see if a world café style would be beneficial to creating questions. Would we have 4 separate meetings, each one focusing on one of the priorities? And would we do one large event or one in different communities? Possibly stakeholder interviews. Decided that a smaller group would be meeting to more focused on the process. Possibly using past data to compile questions. No one way is correct. Possibly doing a variety of options and trying to get a similarity between hospitals.

Ely utilized the Rural Health Resource Center in Duluth for their surveys. They sent out around 800 surveys and had a 42% response rate. Duluth did community focus groups. The county has done a variety of those. The state would like the county to have a specific process and then document how they did it.

Community Assessment Zones-2017

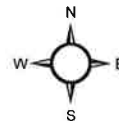

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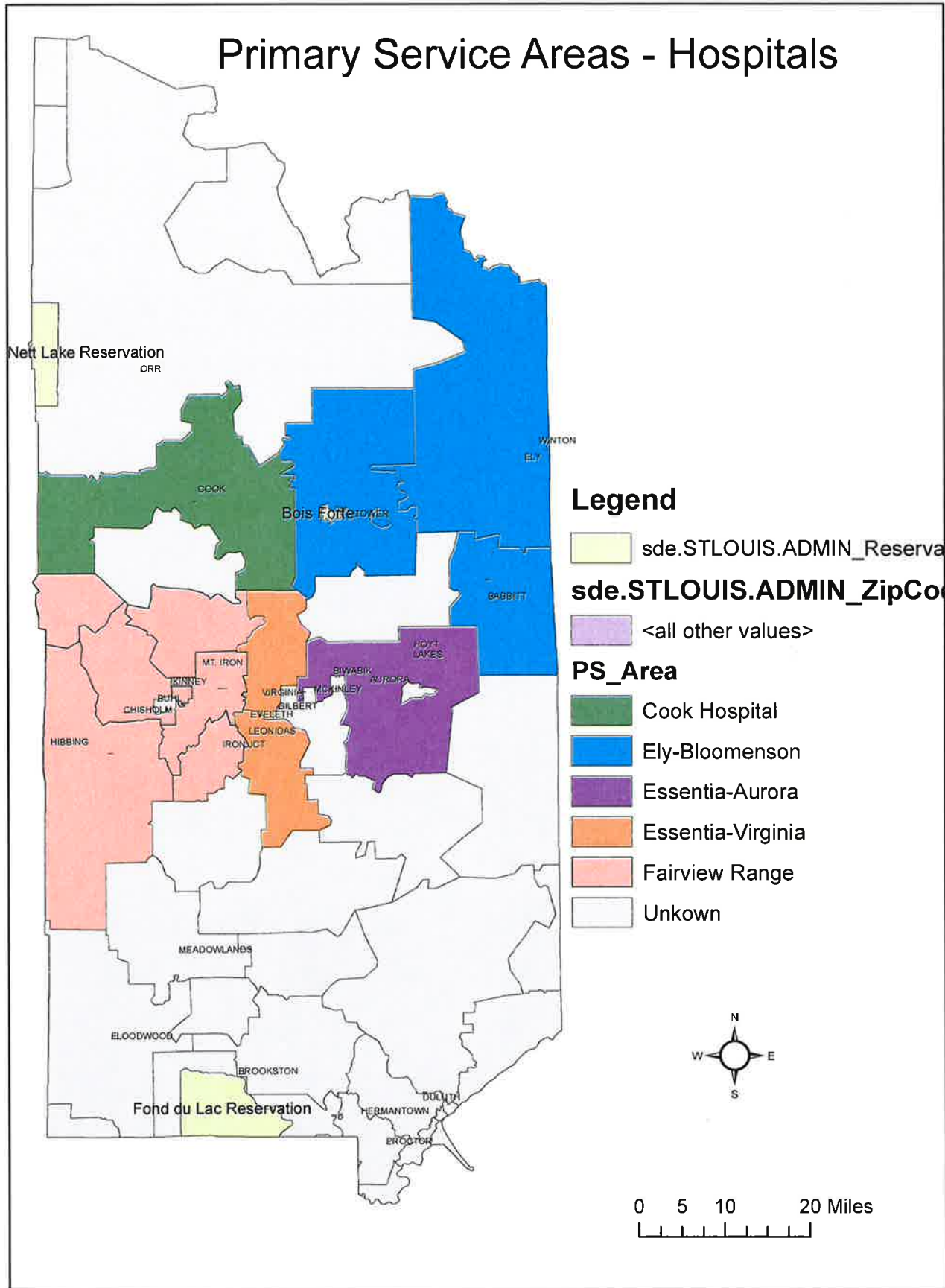
